DISASTER SAFE AT HOME KITS

In sponsorship with **Bank of America** and **Home Depot**, Rebuilding Together Solano County (RTSC) is pleased to announce a special distribution of Disaster Safe At Home Kits dedicated for veterans, active military, and other military families in Solano County. In addition, RTSC will have a raffle for grocery gift cards, raised garden boxes and garden hoses.

RTSC's Disaster Safe At Home Kit includes: an First Aid Kit, Hand Crank Radio / LED Flashlight / Cell Phone Charger, a fire extinguisher, plug-in night lights, emergency blanket, glow sticks, emergency whistle, hand sanitizer, hand soap, face masks, a set of trash bags and disaster backpack with emergency information. Each kit is valued at \$175.00.

All veteran / military households receiving a Disaster Safe At Home Kit are required to provide the following:

- 1. Driver's License showing Solano County address
- 2. Military ID / VA Card or DD-214 Discharge Documentation

NOTE: Each household (i.e. address) is allowed only 1 Safe At Home Kit in the past 12 months.

RTSC is a local nonprofit organization dedicated to allowing low-income veteran, senior and disabled residents the ability to remain in their home – safely and with dignity. Our mission is to provide safe and healthy homes, revitalize communities and rebuild lives.

Since 2009, Rebuilding Together with more than 12,000 community volunteers have provided our home rehab services to more than 40 low-income homeowners as well as held more than 52 community facility workdays in Solano County. In addition, Rebuilding Together has installed and/or donated more than 3,200 smoke and 1,600 carbon monoxide alarms in low-income mobile home parks. Also, RTSC has provided a Drive Thru Food Pantry to low-income veteran / senior / disabled families in Solano County as well as 16 mobile sites including low-income mobile home parks throughout Solano County, a low-income elementary school and organizations serving the disabled. RTSC has distributed more than 750,000 lbs. of food in the past year as part of Feeding America via the Food Bank of Contra Costa / Solano Counties. Estimated value of work is more than \$8,000,000.
