WHAT:

Through grants from Kaiser Permanente, Bank of America, Phillips 66, Valero Benicia Refinery, Wells Fargo and Home Depot, Rebuilding Together Solano County (RTSC) will provide Safe At Home Kits veterans, active military and other military families attending and/or working at Solano Community College.

WHY:

Home health and safety is essential for low-income military, veteran, and senior homeowners to remain in their own home—safely and with dignity.

RTSC's Safe At Home Kit includes:10 year smoke/CO Alarm, a 4-in-1 Emergency Earthquake Tool, an Emergency LED Lantern (Hand Crank and Solar charging) and Cell Phone Charger, a Fire Suppression Blanket, plug-in night light, Kaiser Permanente fleece blanket, emergency whistle, emergency blanket, N95 mask, hand sanitizer, hand soap, face masks, face shield, glow stick, a set of trash bags and emergency information. Each kit is valued at over \$250.00.

# All veteran / military households receiving a Disaster Safe At Home Kit are required to provide the following:

- 1. Driver's License showing Solano County address
- 2. Military ID / VA Card or DD-214 Discharge Documentation

NOTE: Each household (i.e. address) is allowed only 1 Safe At Home Kit since our annual distribution starting Veterans Day 2023.

Rebuilding Together repairs and renovates homes and community facilities in Solano County with the partnership of local companies, concerned residents and service organizations. Our goal is to provide low-income homeowners (veterans, seniors, and disabled individuals) with an avenue to remain in their home—safely and with dignity.

Since 2009, Rebuilding Together with more than 12,000 community volunteers have provided our home rehab services to more than 42 low-income homeowners as well as held more than 52 community facility workdays in Solano County. In addition, Rebuilding Together has installed and/or donated more than 4,810 smoke and 2,900 carbon monoxide alarms in low-income mobile home parks. Also, RTSC has distributed more than 1,800 Safe at Home Kits. Finally, RTSC has provided a food pantry for low-income veteran / senior / disabled families in Solano County since 2018 as well as over 10 mobile sites including low-income mobile home parks, a low-income Vallejo elementary school and organizations serving the disabled. RTSC has distributed more than 750,000 lbs. of food in the past year as part of Feeding America via the Food Bank of Contra Costa / Solano Counties. Estimated value of work is more than \$10,000,000.

Rebuilding Together Solano County (RTSC) provides free home repair and rehabilitation services for low-income homeowners and community facilities. During a one-day project, local businesses, community members, skilled tradesman and concerned residents come together from all walks of life to repair and restore low-income homes in our Solano County neighborhoods. RTSC is a local affiliate of Rebuilding Together USA, a national organization that includes more than 125 affiliates across the nation.
